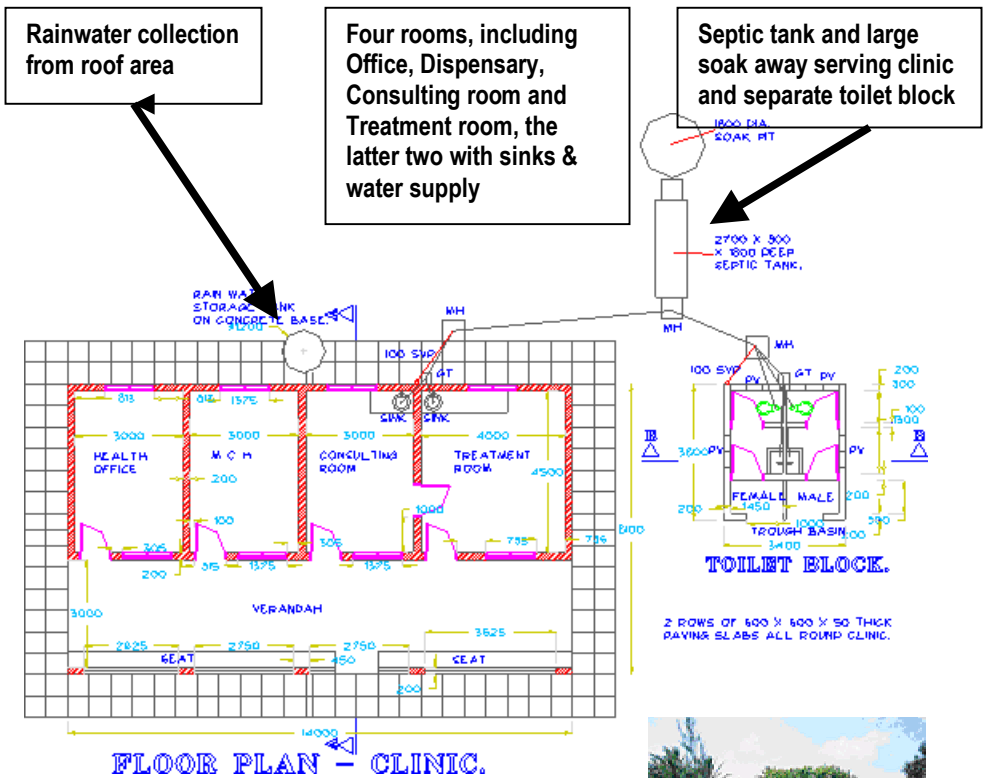

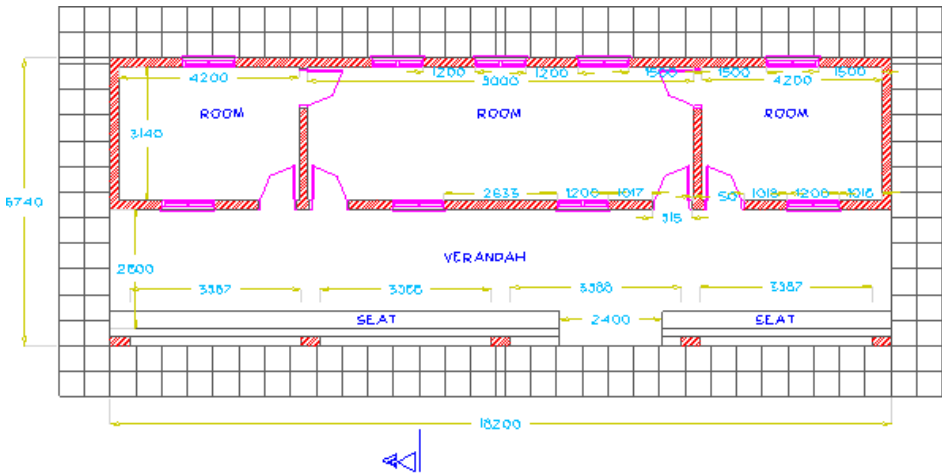

Community Centre Architects Plans



FLOOR PLAN - WELFARE CENTRE - KADZINUNI

The building is about 19m x 7m (62" x 23") with three rooms, two smaller for ladies & men's workshops and a large central meeting hall for community events based on the design of the Bomani building shown below. Built of blocks and rendered in cement with a veranda with seating.

As with the Clinic we aim to provide electricity for the centre by using roof mounted solar panels, bringing power to Kadzinuni for the first time!
